Zoning refers to the segmentation of the Slovak territory into several *soil zones* according to various factors which influence this soil configuration in the country..

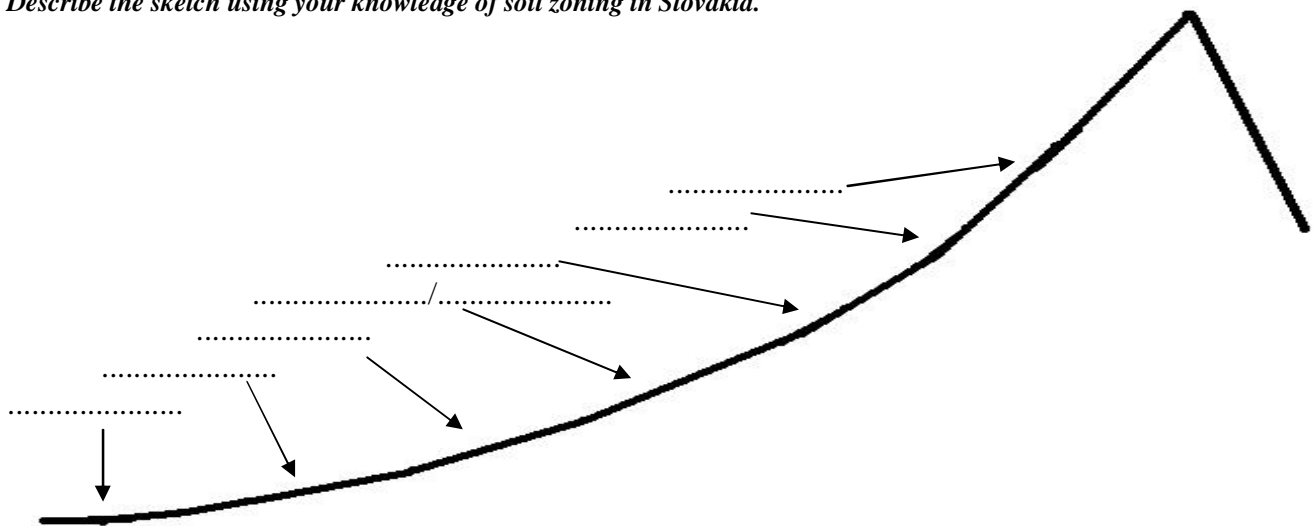
